Practice Ideas - Use metronome & Tuner


- 1. *Con Grazia,* with grace, **gracefully,** makes me think of dancing/clapping/stomping, guitar/ **Flamenco Spanish Style**... What articulation style do you want to express here? **Experiment with articulation style** you want on the pick up Eb and with the rhythm 8th and 2 16th's. Check ear and tuner for **intonation, and centered sound on the C's & Db's!** (In the whole Etude this is a **Key Change** to F Minor)
- 2. I love how the **16th's lead to the dancing/clapping rhythms**. **Bring out the contrast** of the **articulation** and the **flowing 16ths**.
- 3. P delicato, delicate ~what does this mean to you? Practice 1st without and then with the mordents. Also bring out the Meter 123 1
- 4. Is a combination of the 16ths, and the dotted quarter that sings and transitions to the Delicato... Consider all expressive markings!

Practice Ideas - use metronome & tuner

- 1. Main Melody of this etude, key change to C minor and C common time. Singing, Spanish Flare, Expression in these pick up notes to G! Practice 3 notes G B F then F Eb D G g - and then all pick up notes to G. Consider some Rubato and notice all expressive markings. Also, try practicing with some harmonic fingerings on opening gesture.
- 2. Slurs & Ties Subdivide, tonguing into 8ths and Shape, Sing and open the quarter tied notes with Vibrato, Vowels ahh to oh and < or >
- 3. Practice legato sections, all articulated too, vary articulations, listen for even rhythm and sound that lead the phrase to the long expressive notes.
- 4. The heart is a **color change** (hints at the f minor) and ending of the **phrase shape** < to >.





Practice Ideas (use metronome & tuner)

- 1. Chunking: 5 notes legato tongued, Tu tk t t, 2 slurred, flutter tongue, sing & play... then 9 notes. Build tempo with metronome ~ Vivo con Bravura!!!
- 2. **Piano to Forte.... articulation, dynamics intonation in upper register.** Practice with **harmonic fingerings** to help with air speed and support and intonation. Practice slurred and tongued.
- 3. **FF con fuoco , with FIRE!** Your most gorgeous full, even, rich, legato sound. Smooth even fingers too! Especially intervals c to d in the staff, and high d to e, for even, fluid movement & sound...
