What is a phrase? A musical sentence. A musical line. A sound shape.

One of my favorite things to do is to find and shape the phrasing of the music. It is never to early to begin exploring the phra-sing. Be expressive in your practice. Enjoy!

What is phrasing?

Shaping the, sentence, the musical line using: inflection, shape, color, nuance, dynamics, intonation... to communicate & express musical ideas.

How to find a Phrase? Here are some ideas:

- **1. Sing it**. Play it... Where does it breathe? How does it come to life? Notice your natural musical instinct!
- **2. Listen** to many recordings. Hear it in a live concert. The art of listening, 4 ears, physical, mental emotional & spiritual.
- **3.** Look for the **conversation**. What kind of talking is going? Who and how many are conversing?
- **4.** Study the **Musical Style** of your piece. Baroque, classical, romantic, french, contemporary...
- **5. Study** the rhythm, melody and harmony.
- **6.** Look at the **shape** of the notes. The Landscape/Music-scape Is it a mountain, valley, peaks, turns, ocean, desert, forest...
- 7. Find the **whole Form** of your piece. This will help you find the musical paragraphs and sentences.
